This bibliography is selective in several ways. First, Mill scholarship is voluminous, and my knowledge of it is quite limited. Second, I list only works that I think valuable, though not necessarily correct. Third, with some exceptions, I do not in general list separately the individual essays in collections of essays (e.g. I do not list separately the essays reprinted in Lyons's Rights, Welfare, and Mill's Moral Theory).
